Contributed to the first-ever WHO guideline on CHWs, highlighting 7 of 8 proCHW best practices

Created the proCHW

countries adopting
proCHW policies



Set up the first CHW Speaker Bureau, facilitating CHWs attending and participating in community health events, planning meetings, and policy discussions



40 countries have proCHW policies with CHWs who are accredited and salaried



120 million pieces of PPE were distributed to CHWs in 18 countries during the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020



10,000 CHWs have received advocacy training as part of the Coalition
